Management of confirmed cases of COVID-19 amongst the school community.	Individuals may be exposed to COVID-19.	<p>Close contacts will be identified via NHS Test and Trace and APTCOO is no longer expected to undertake contact tracing.</p> <p>NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case to identify close contacts.</p> <p>From 16th August 2021, children under the age of 18 years and 6 months old have no longer been required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case.</p> <p>Instead, children will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take an LFT. PCR tests are, at date of publication, not required for an individual to self-isolate, unless they are in one of three categories</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> they wish to claim the Test and Trace Support Payment they have a health condition that means they may be suitable for new COVID-19 treatments they are taking LFD tests as part of research or surveillance programmes, and the programme asks them to do so. <p>18-year-olds are now treated the same way as children until 6 months after their 18th birthday, to allow them the opportunity to get fully vaccinated. At which point, they will be subject to the same rules as adults and so if they choose not to get vaccinated, they will need to self-isolate if identified as a close contact (unless there is a medical reason for being exempt from vaccination or they are taking part in a vaccine trial).</p> <p>From 16th August 2021:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> adults who are fully vaccinated (defined as 2 doses of MHRA-approved vaccine with second dose at least 14 days prior to exposure to a confirmed COVID-19 case) unvaccinated adults who have a medical reason for being exempt from vaccination adults who are taking part or have taken part in an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial and those who are under 18 years old. Instead, they are advised to take daily LFTs.</p> <p>APTCOO will continue to work together with health protection teams in the case of a local outbreak. If there is an outbreak APTCOO may be advised to temporarily reintroduce some control measures.</p>				
Use of face coverings in education settings to minimise transmission of COVID-19.	Individuals may be exposed to COVID-19.	<p>Face coverings are no longer advised for pupils, staff and visitors either in classrooms or in communal areas at APTCOO. This is partly due to the nature of our learners whose additional needs make the wearing of face coverings difficult.</p> <p>APTCOO permits the continuing use of face masks if the individual wishes to continue using one. No learner is denied education on the grounds of whether they are, or are not, wearing a face covering.</p> <p>On dedicated transport, staff will be asked to wear face masks and learners encouraged to wear one too and from sites.</p> <p>APTCOO reserves the right to make adjustments and introduce new control measures in line with government guidelines and public health advice. All changes will be communicated to learners, families and staff in advance.</p> <p>Face coverings (whether transparent or cloth) must fit securely around the face to cover the nose and mouth and be made with a breathable material capable of filtering airborne particles.</p> <p>Face visors or shields can be worn by those exempt from wearing a face covering but they are not an equivalent alternative in terms of source control of virus transmission. Individuals may be exposed to COVID-19.	<p>APTCOO's outbreak management plan is:</p> <p>To review and reinforce testing, hygiene and ventilation measures when the following outbreak thresholds are reached at any setting:</p> <p>"2 children, pupils, students and staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period".</p> <p>APTCOO will review the following measures:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Whether any activities can take place outdoors. 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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ways to improve ventilation indoors where this would not significantly impact thermal comfort. One-off "enhanced" cleaning with emphasis on touch points and any shared equipment. Learners are and will continue to be encouraged to test at home and APTCOO will do its utmost to facilitate supplies as and where needed. Staff have undertaken daily testing since January 2022 to minimise transmission of COVID-19 across all settings. <p>APTCOO will contact the DFE helpline in the event that a child or member of staff develops serious illness (e.g. students or staff members admitted to hospital or a death as a result of a confirmed COVID-19 infection)</p>				
Increased risk of transmission due to inadequate hygiene and inadequate PPE.*	Individuals may be exposed to COVID-19.	<p>Hand and respiratory hygiene</p> <p>Frequent and thorough hand cleaning is regular practice at APTCOO. Daily cleaning charts are thoroughly enforced at each APTCOO setting. All staff continue to ensure that pupils clean their hands regularly. This can be done with soap and water or hand sanitiser.</p> <p>Staff reinforce messages (to learners and others) to;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands. Wash hands immediately after doing so. Catch it, Bin it, Kill it. Cover cough / sneeze with tissue, throwing tissue in the bin and washing hands. 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		<p>Staff supervise young children and pupils with complex needs to ensure they wash their hands for 20 seconds with soap and running water.</p> <p>Use of hand sanitiser is supervised to minimise risk of ingestion. Consider alternatives such as skin friendly skin cleaning wipes.</p> <p>Use of hand gel and accessibility to children is risk assessed within a COSHH assessment.</p>				
Increased risk of transmission due to inadequate cleaning regimes.	Individuals may be exposed to COVID-19.	<p>An appropriate cleaning schedule has been implemented and maintained, including regular daily cleaning of areas and equipment, with a particular focus on frequently touched surfaces.</p> <p>The risks from any hazardous substances used for cleaning is COSHH assessed and subject to a cleaning checklist as part of daily opening and closing procedures. Actions on positive learner/staff LFT results have allowed us to put procedure into practice and minimise transmission in the workplace.</p> <p>Findings are formally communicated to relevant persons. Key considerations are given to use of products in classrooms e.g. safe storage.</p>	L	L	L	
Increased risk of transmission due to insufficient ventilation.	Individuals may be exposed to COVID-19.	<p>APTCCO strives to balance the competing demands of ensuring that its premises are well ventilated while maintaining a comfortable teaching environment.</p> <p>Poorly ventilated areas of school must be identified.</p> <p>No areas at school are poorly ventilated; a mix of open windows, doors (where secure and appropriate), CO² monitors and availability of open spaces, along with low footfall of staff and learners, make this a negligible concern.</p> <p>However, we will continue to assess and monitor if variables changes or new challenges arise.</p> <p>APTCCO prioritises natural ventilation to ensure the circulation of air and keeps internal doors open where security and safety considerations permit.</p>	L	L	L	
Failure to follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19. *	Individuals may be exposed to COVID-19.	<p>When an individual develops COVID-19 symptoms or has a positive test, they must follow public health advice on when to self-isolate and what to do.</p> <p>They must not come into school if</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • they have symptoms, • have had a positive test result, or 	M	L	L	

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> other reasons requiring them to stay home due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19 (for example if they are required to quarantine). <p>If anyone in school develops COVID-19 symptoms, however mild, they must be sent home and they must follow public health advice.</p> <p>A symptomatic learner or one who tests positive during LFTs will be moved to the designated isolation area until parent/carer arrives for collection. These are as follows:</p> <p>Botany Avenue – small front office North Farm House – meeting room near the front door. Cameleon Lodge – back room away from other learners and exit through the fire door when collected. Sandy Lane - reception area near the front door. The back door can be used for exit for non-affected learners and staff.</p> <p>If a pupil is awaiting collection, they must be left in a room on their own if possible and safe to do so. A window is opened for fresh air ventilation if possible. Appropriate PPE is used if close contact is necessary.</p> <p>Any rooms used are cleaned after they have left, following government guidance for cleaning non-healthcare setting.</p> <p>Everyone MUST wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds with soap and running water after any contact with someone who is unwell.</p> <p>APTCOO has ensured that storing waste, prior to disposal due to confirmed or suspected COVID-19 has not created any additional hazards in the following categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fire risk Impede emergency exit routes Trip hazard Away from learners <p>The household (including any siblings) should follow the PHE stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection: Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk).</p> <p>Asymptomatic testing</p>				

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		<p>Testing remains important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection within schools. That is why, whilst some measures are relaxed, others will remain, and if necessary, in response to the latest data, we are be prepared to step measures up or down in future depending on local circumstances.</p> <p>APTCCO retains a small asymptomatic testing site (ATS) at each site until further notice so we can offer testing to learners who are unable to test themselves at home. Testing remains voluntary but learners are encouraged to participate.</p> <p>Confirmatory PCR tests Staff and pupils with a positive LFD test result should self-isolate in line with the stay-at-home guidance for households. At the time of writing, confirmatory PCR tests are not necessary for self-isolation to be enforced.</p>

Individuals may be exposed to COVID-19.	<p>APTCCO does not currently have any learners identified as clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV).</p> <p>In this were to change, the Head Teacher would communicate appropriately with APTCCO's most vulnerable children and ensure health care plans are updated where necessary.</p> <p>Additional tailored arrangements would be implemented to support medical needs of pupils who will be attending schools and documented within health care plans.</p> <p>Health care plans and arrangements for supporting medical needs of learners are communicated to relevant persons only.</p> <p>Updated health care plans to be signed by parent / carer.</p>	L	L	L

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		<p>If an employee is deemed vulnerable is and requires additional risk controls, then a specific individual risk assessment MUST be completed by a suitably trained person. The F45-1 risk assessment template is used to facilitate this process.</p> <p>No staff members are currently new or expecting mothers. If this changes at any point, APTCOO will undertake a risk assessment using the SR14 template.</p> <p>Any individual risk assessments for staff must and is completed in conjunction with the employee and manager.</p> <p>Regular communication for both parties to discuss concerns and additional / reduced control measures.</p> <p>The risk assessment must be reviewed by both the employee and manager regularly and updated to reflect any changes to arrangements.</p>

This happens very rarely as APTCOO does not have contractors in during school hours and arranges the vast majority of work for after-school hours and the half-term period.</p> <p>Signage will be displayed around school to indicate any local arrangements e.g. for parents and visitors on arrival to site.</p>	L	L	L

Individuals may be exposed to COVID-19.	<p>APTCOO receives its PPE through the Department for Education and sources other cleaning products in bulk from local suppliers.</p> <p>Admin basepoint leads at each site, overseen by Operations Lead Jacob Graley, will be responsible for checking stocks of PPE, cleaning materials and hygiene products throughout the day.</p> <p>The Admin and Finance Lead, Sam Wright, is responsible for ordering and sourcing stocks of PPE, cleaning materials and hygiene products.</p>	L	L	L	
Risk of fire and delayed evacuation due to insufficient fire safety management.	Serious injury / ill-health / death in the event of a fire.	<p>Fire risk assessment to take into account any changes to the use of building and / or rooms within it.</p> <p>Consider any new fire hazards which may have been introduced, e.g. increased supplies of PPE (source of fuel / block exits), alcohol hand gel (flammable – kept away from heat sources) etc. This is checked daily with opening and closing procedures to prevent obstruction and poor storage.</p> <p>Doors propped open (to minimise contact and aid ventilation) MUST be closed on sounding of the fire alarm (during emergency evacuation) and at the end of the school day (overnight). This is checked daily with the opening and closing procedures for each base point.</p> <p>Safe exit from the building will be considered during any reconfiguration of room layout / usage.</p> <p>Changes to fire evacuation procedures or roles supporting fire evacuation (wardens / marshals absent) will be communicated to all staff via on-site practical walkthroughs with staff and young people.</p> <p>Fire drill is completed termly or following changes and a record maintained in the fire logbook.</p> <p>Personal Emergency Evacuation Plans (PEEPs) MUST be reviewed to ensure support can be provided to staff and pupils.</p> <p>Contingency plans in place for alternative support for PEEPs due to staff absence.</p> <p>Alcohol hand gel MUST not be kept in cars due to fire risk in hot temperatures.</p>	L	L	L
